

ELECTION TRAINING IN POWYS

Herio is a joint venture between Powys and Carmarthen People First groups. We agreed that it was very important to offer election training to our members. We wanted to explain what powers the Welsh Assembly has and to

give information about how the voting system is used in elections of Assembly Members.

We wanted to raise awareness of the devolved areas of responsibilities of the Welsh Assembly. Some of our members had not voted before and others didn't understand what the Welsh Assembly does.

We arranged a tour of the Senedd in Cardiff Bay. We watched the Assembly Members in action in the chamber. Lowri Williams did a workshop around the devolved powers and Kirsty Williams AM, met with us during our visit. The day was very enjoyable and we had a better understanding of what happens at the Senedd.

We then held 2 days of election training, one in Brecon and the other in Newtown. The training was fun and interactive. We talked about voting and the different ways you could vote. We looked at the devolved areas of responsibilities the Assembly has. We discussed the reasons people have for voting and we produced voting slogans to put on a banner. We filled in a question card to take home with us so we had questions to put to any politicians we met during the election campaign. Everyone who attended the training said they had enjoyed it and it would make them more likely to vote.

Mark Llewellyn from Pontypridd University is doing some research he asked the group about their experiences of Continuing Health Care and how they had found the process of filling in the forms and whether they felt it was working for them. Only a few people in the group had been through the process. Some thought it had worked really well and others thought it had not. They felt worse off and that social services and health were arguing about who was going to pay for what. Mark is keen to hear from anyone who has experience of continuing health care so pop in the office or ring us and we can give you his number or pass on your stories for you.

Joe has sent letters to all the Local Authorities across Wales asking if they are cutting services to people with learning disabilities in their area. Powys has not responded yet.

The National conference will be held on the 3rd and 4th of October 2016 and will be at the Futures Inn in Cardiff. The theme of the Conference is Self-Advocacy and will be called "Our Lives and Our Rights".
